Highlights of January 2012



- Between 28 30 January we organised a training activity addressing pilot school teachers in Antalya. As it was a major event with 94 participants, including pilot school teachers, pilot school principals, monitoring and national and international experts, the organization was complex. The strong ownership of the MoNE, and more specifically of the BoE, was underlined by the involvement of Dr Ünal Akyüz, Head of the Project Coordination Department (MoNE) and Dr Zafer Çelik, Head of Education Systems and Policies Department (BoE). Representatives of the EU Delegation to Turkey and the Central Finance and Contracts Unit followed the sessions closely. While national experts Dr Ahmet Doğanay and Dr Bülent Tarman contributed to the event as moderators for the group work, prof. David Kerr (UK) and Prof. Rolf Gollob (Switzerland) also participated in the seminars and provided an outsiders' perspective. The main outcomes of the activity may be summarised as follows:
 - The teachers were provided with a sound platform to deliver feedback on the activities they implemented throughout the first semester. Their valuable ideas and examples of good practice will be used to improve these activities before they are compiled as a textbook to be used nation-wide in the next academic year.
 - The Democratic School Culture Working Group (DSCWG) also conducted separate sessions together with the principals of the secondary pilot schools. During these sessions, the school principals who participated in the study visit to Germany shared their experience with their colleagues;
 - In a plenary session the teachers attended a training on the methodologies to be used in EDC/HRE courses. This session was delivered and supervised by Prof. Rolf Gollob from the University of Zurich.
 - The teachers had a unique chance to see the activities designed for the secend semester in advance and provided feedback. Their direct involvement in designing activities yielded fruitful results and helped them feel more secure about what they will do in the coming period.
 - In a plenary session, Dr Oya Taneri, our key evaluation expert of the project, made a presentation on the measurement and evaluation aspect of EDC/HRE and made recommendations.
 - Representatives of the Material Development Working Group (MDWG) also participated in the sessions and group work in order to collect feedback about the visual materials that accompany the existing activities.











- & We visited our pilot schools in Sakarya and Elazığ. These visits were also a part of the third round of school visits which had to be spread over three months in order not to overlap with other project activities and in order to ensure a continuous momentum and cooperation between the Generation Democracy team and the pilot schools.
- On January 31 and February 1, a group-specific training for the Capacity Building Working Group was organised in Ankara. Under the guidance of Prof Rolf Gollob, our international expert coming from University of Zurich, the group worked on the preparation of Training Modules for the upcoming training sessions intended for May. Mr Bekir Şirin, CBWG Coordinator and Mr Osman Taşkaya, Head of In-service Training Unit also took part in the training.
- & Preparations for the study visits to Ireland and Norway (Council of Europe Teacher Training Centre for EDC/HRE) started.

Synergies with other institutions and actions

In 2013 The Generation Democracy Project is going to train 240 teachers who will then provide cascade training to their colleagues in coming years. In order to institutionalise the capacity-building training activities and to deliver them as part of the in-service training programme of the MoNE, a number of meetings were held with the following:

- & The In-Service Training Department of the MoNE was contacted in order to ensure that the training courses developed by the CBWG are coordinated well and in accordance with MoNE/BoE procedures.
- X The DG for Basic Education and Education Policy was visited as they are also working on another new elective course 'Law and Justice'. The main aim is to avoid any overlapping elements in both curricula.
- A meeting with TÜBİTAK was also on the agenda. TÜBİTAK is about to start writing the textbooks for mainly natural science courses that will be taught in the forthcoming period. One of CBWG's tasks is to provide EDC/HRE training to those who are writing textbooks. Close cooperation with these experts will ensure that the new textbooks will be in line with democratic values and human rights.

What will we be doing in February 2013?

More specifically the major upcoming activities in 2013 may be summarised as follows:

- & Both the Legislation Review Working Group and the Curriculum Review Working Group will finalise and submit their draft reports to the BoE for its initial opinion. Then each will organise a workshop to share its draft report with stakeholders to obtain their opinion. The aim of the LRWG workshop is to develop recommendations with the support of academic, law experts, NGOs and other relevant stakeholders.
- Now that the first semester is over and we are getting ready for the nationwide implementation of the curriculum, it is high time that we started raising awareness on the new elective course in every corner of Turkey. As a part of our communication strategy, we are going to produce television spots and we have invited professionals in this field to come up with their innovative ideas. In the second week of February, a commission consisting of the members of the BoE, the CoE and the national communication experts will convene to choose the best scenario for the TV spots. Production of the spots will than begin.











- With a view to encouraging teachers get involved in designing content of our project, our communication strategy includes a competition, open to all teachers. The best examples of good teaching practice coming from this competition will be compiled in a supplementary activity book for EDC/HRE. The competition will be announced in February and we invite all our pilot school teachers to join.
- & The secreteriat will be busy with the preparations for the upcoming Study Visit to Ireland which is planned for April.
- Coordination and cooperation between The Generation Democracy team and the DG for Basic Education, as well as TÜBİTAK, will continue to ensure the best possible outcome from the training activities to be organised by the Capacity Building Working Group in May and onwards. Some of the training modules will address curriculum developers, textbook authors and textbook reviewers; therefore, strong coordination is needed among the relevant institutions.

& Visibility

- The initial steps for the production of the TV spots have been taken in close cooperation between the project communication experts and the Press Department of the Ministry of National Education.
- The Secretariat team participated in the closing conference of the EU Camp Project "Children Studies in Turkey" organised by Middle East Technical University on 25th January. The event was a good opportunity for exchange of good practice that already exist in the field of Children's Rights and children related projects.
- As for the more day-to-day operations, the Secretariat will continue to ensure the visibility of the pilot schools and their relevant activities.
